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PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

This week in Caterpillars we have been discussing animals and their environments. This allowed us to learn new and exciting words such as habitat and carnivores. We worked in small groups to sort animals into the environments they live in such as forests, the sea and the farm. We shared different facts we knew about animals. We spoke about animals we have seen before in our own experiences when visiting the zoo, the farm and the beach. We elaborated on this by reading one of our core stories of 'Dear Zoo' and used the story sack to role play this. We then created our own boxes to deliver animals to each other as gifts.



Butterflies Class

This week in butterflies, we have been focusing on the topic of occupations where the children have been exploring various job roles. The children have role played opticians where they have 'tested' each other's eyesight by using shape and number charts. They also explored trying on a wide range of frames, deciding which ones they would like to 'purchase'. Whilst learning about builders, the children have used sand and shaving foam to create a 'cement' which they then used whilst constructing some excellent models. The class have created their own toolboxes discussing what each of the tools are used for, and they have also worked together whilst pretending to be mechanics and 'fixing' the vehicles in the garden. The children have been making comparisons in regards to size, length and weight whilst wrapping and sending parcels in our Preschool post office. They have also been practising their subitising skills whilst using our postal themed tough tray to 'deliver' letters featuring spot and finger formations to the correct numbered houses.
