On Thursday evening, members of the social action group, along with their parents and carers, attended the Peterborough Citizens Spring Assembly at Queen Katharine Academy. They did wonderfully in presenting the work that they have already done towards the housing and homelessness campaign and their dreams for what's to come next.

The shared a poem that they worked together with Mrs Bright to create and represented our school incredibly.. We thought our school community would want to celebrate these things with them and share in the poem they have written. We hope you enjoy reading it.

It started way back last year,
When we reached out with a listening ear.
We wanted to hear what was on the school community's mind,
And see what solutions we might be able to find.

We took our issues to Nene Park Academy,
To find the top issues: we had to choose from three.
With homelessness and housing being on our heart,
We knew this was the campaign with which we had to make a start.

Training at QKA taught us about the housing and homelessness issue,
We heard some stories that made us need a tissue.
Inspired by this we worked with Carezone creating boxes for those going into temporary accommodation,
Asking our school community to provide essentials for people in this situation

At Peterborough Museum we were able to meet the decision makers
To hold them to account and remind them about being givers and not just takers.
30% affordable housing is what they agreed to pledge,
But of the change we want to make, this is just the edge.

We've met with council members in our school to work out what came next,
Adrian Chapman and Rob Hill answered our questions giving more context.
We talked about how we could work together to make the difference we desire,
There's still much more to do but we've certainly lit the fire.

There's a big development happening at Peterborough Showground,
So we met Ashley Butterfield, the developer, we found.
He hosted us at the Marriott hotel giving us goodies to take home.
We heard about the development plans and we made our questions known.

So here we are at the Spring Assembly at QKA
As you can see there's lots that gone before today.
There's still much more to come and you can play your part,
By thinking about the difference we can make and leading with your heart.

NEWS FROM PRESCHOOL

Caterpillars Class

We have been continuing our exploration of mini beasts in the environment due to the weather change. We managed to find lots of little bugs in forest school on Wednesday! We created our own spiders using playdough and pipe cleaners and we have been playing the bug bingo game in small groups - showing our turn taking skills and awareness of rules.

We have also been exploring Goldilocks and the three bears this week, sharing our knowledge of the story and bringing this into our play in the home corner, using different size bowls to serve our peers some porridge, retelling the story to others using pictures and props and using compare bears to use new/different language of sizes.
