### **PRESCHOOL NEWS**

#### **Caterpillars Class**

This week in Caterpillars we have been exploring 'emotions'. We explored the story 'The Colour Monster' which allowed us to discuss different feelings through the use of colours.

We created our own colour monsters using tissue paper and glue. We mixed colours to see what happens and we categorised dinosaurs due to their property of colour.



#### **Butterflies Class**

This week in Butterflies we have been continuing to explore our current focus of 'Our Senses'. Throughout the week, the children have participated in a blindfold taste testing activity, and they took part in a smelling game where they made predictions of what each of the mystery scents could possibly be. The children have taken part in a wide range of creative experiences this week, such as painting with herbs and spices and making a texture collage. They have also created their very own musical instruments, such as shakers, which they then later used during a group music session.

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## THE HALL WAS ALIVE WITH THE SOUND OF MUSIC!

On Tuesday afternoon, we were delighted to welcome Peterborough Music School to Eye C of E Primary for two excellent performances. EYFS and KS1 enjoyed a singing and dancing workshop and KS2 enjoyed a drumming performance. The children were able to sing and dance as well as building on their musical knowledge and skills. They learnt about the importance of keeping in time with each other and about the different parts of the drum kit, The hall was filled with music and excitement!
