GROW AWARD

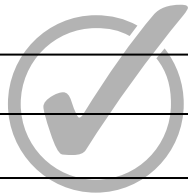
This week we had KS2 GROW Celebration Collective Worship. Well done to the children who received the awards.

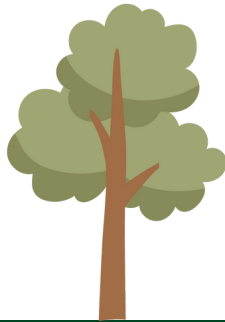
Butterflies News

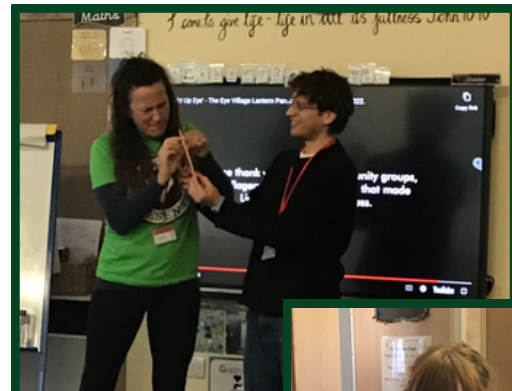
NEWS FROM THE FOREST
