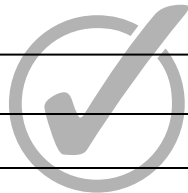

NEWS FROM THE FOREST

This week at forest school, we have been going on bug hunts. We found lots of different species and then identified them from our bug books. We also found an abundance of fungi! It was wonderful to see the children's interests in these different types so we used the iPad to identify which ones we had in our forest. Some children found some newts in the meadow area so decided to make a pond for them using different materials to build. They made sure that the newts would be able to get in and out of the pond. We also investigated what we needed to feed them which resulted in a worm hunt! The children noticed we have a lot of ladybirds. This sparked the idea of a lady bird count. In one session we found 18 lady birds! The younger children did a forest scavenger hunt finding items on their charts ticking them off as they go. Lots of fun was had in the forest this week!

PRESCHOOL NEWS

This week, Preschool have been celebrating World Nursery Rhyme Week, where the children have engaged in a wide range of experiences linked to the five official songs of 2024. These are Twinkle Twinkle, The Big Ship Sails, Five Currant Buns, Incy Wincy Spider, and Old MacDonald.

Caterpillars Class

Each day this week, we have focused on a different familiar nursery rhyme. Some examples of what we have been up to this week are; making our current buns using icing, cherries and fairy cakes and then selling them in the 'bakers shop' exploring the value of money and role playing in the home corner. We have made our own incy wincy spiders using black card and pipe cleaners and other materials. We then went on a spider hunt in the garden! We discussed where we think spiders may be hiding and watched some spider fact videos on the large interactive screen. We also explored all things space when focusing on '5 little men in a flying saucer'. We created our own aliens and discussed different planets, how we travel to space and what we might find there!



Butterflies Class

Throughout the week, the children have been using their imaginations whilst playing in our Bakers Shop role play area. They have taken part in a cooking activity exploring weighing ingredients whilst baking star biscuits, and they have explored prepositions during an incy wincy spider drainpipe craft. The children have shown a particular interest in the rhyme 'The Big Ship Sails', and we have extended this area of interest by also making a link to pirate ships. The children explored tea bag printing whilst creating their own treasure maps, they worked together to construct a large pirate ship whilst using the large wooden blocks in the garden, and they even put their balancing skills to the test whilst successfully walking the 'plank'
