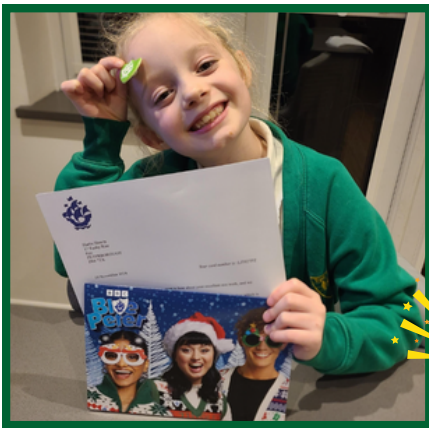

This week Christmas came to the forest! Father Christmas left us some decorations to use and we were also able to make our own decorations out of natural things we found in our forest. We used these to decorate the forest area. We made a grotto and sleighs and even a Father Christmas tree house for all our furry friends to curl up and keep warm



The younger children made mud mince pies in Father Christmas' mud kitchen and warmed themselves by the fire. Children were using their imaginations and role play skills to act out their favourite Christmas experiences.

We chatted around the fire about what we enjoy doing with our families and friends at Christmas and rounded off our forest school session by singing some Christmas songs.



PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

This week, we have been exploring Arctic animals. We discussed where they live in the world and why they choose to live there. We explored a range of different materials to represent snow in the tuff tray such as polystyrene balls, cotton wool and white glitter and added arctic animals, such as arctic hare, polar bears, reindeers, seals, in. This allowed the children to use the animals to role play, explore the different features and colours of the animals and share information they already knew about them. We also learnt new facts about Arctic animals and shared a fact book together during group time.. Did you know a polar bear's skin is in fact black, but their white fur covers it all but their nose? We created our own penguin pictures using different craft materials and we demonstrated how to waddle like penguins too!

Butterflies Class

This week in Butterflies, we have extended on last week's learning of road safety by learning about various modes of transport. Throughout the week, the children have practiced crossing the road safely and they have carried out a transport survey from outside the setting. The children have been incredibly imaginative this week while going on a variety of make believe journeys and whilst fixing the ride on vehicles in the Butterflies garage. The class have seemed to particularly enjoy exploring magnetic forces whilst using the large wands to explore moving a range of hot air balloons (with paper clips attached) around our tuff tray and table. The children have also been busy developing their turn taking skills whilst using the drain pipe tracks in the garden to race vehicles, where we then incorporated using mathematical equipment to measure the distance of how far each one had travelled.
