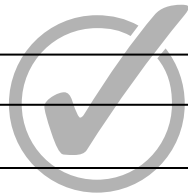

NEWS FROM THE FOREST

This week, in the forest, we have been thinking about our senses. We have been taking time to use each of our senses throughout our sessions in forest school. Here are some examples of some of the senses based activities that we took part in:

Touch - we felt the trees and did bark rubbing

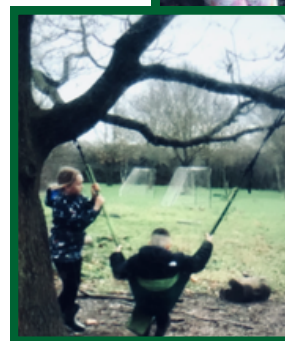
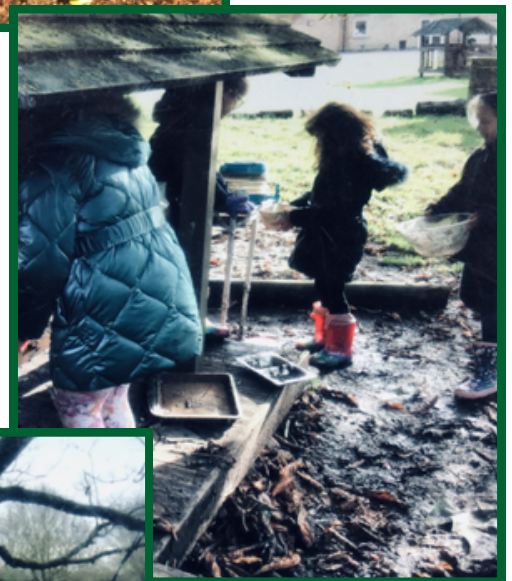
Smell- we made a fire and described the smell

Sight- we used our bird watching area and made binoculars

Taste - we tried to catch raindrops with our tongues

Hearing- we sat around the fire circle and listened to noises around us, describing the different sounds.

The children also made senses boxes by finding items in the forest for others to test out.





PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

Our story of the week has been Goldilocks. The children used the story sack puppets to tell the story and extend it with their own visions and imagination afterwards. We used props such as the wooden house and dolls house furniture to enhance the story. We enjoyed some yummy porridge for snack time just like Goldilocks and the bears. We used our descriptive language to describe how our porridge tasted - with toppings of jam or syrup! We also explored porridge oats in the tuff tray with bowls of different sizes, spoons and jugs to scoop and measure. This allowed us to use our mathematical language during our play. The children have even been describing the size of their bowls etc. during meal times showing their knowledge and understanding of the Goldilocks story during routine times.



Butterflies Class

This week, we have been learning all about the animals that live in the Arctic and Antarctic! Throughout the week, the children have demonstrated high levels of engagement whilst taking part in an animal rescue mission where they used warm water and paint brushes to release the animals from inside the blocks of ice. The children have been practising their mathematical skills whilst comparing quantities during an animal feeding task, and they have used a range of one-handed tools to create some wonderful pieces of artwork such as penguins and polar bears. The children have been developing their turn taking abilities whilst taking part in a sensory experience of making snow dough. They have been practising their listening and attention skills during circle time with Peter penguin, and they have also worked together to create their very own adaptation of the story 'we're going on a polar bear hunt'.

BIKEABILITY

Last Friday, some of the children in Year 3 and 4 took part in the level 1 Bikability. Here are some of the things that they learnt:

- How to maintain your cycle: making sure their ride is in tip-top condition and make simple repairs
- How to glide: smooth, calm and collected
- How to control their bike: including setting off, cruising, slowing down, braking and stopping. They even learnt to pedal one handed!
- How to pedal: without feeling wobbly or out of control
- To be aware of their surroundings: looking behind and turning around obstacles



SPORTING ACHIEVEMENTS

We're very proud of our year 2 children who took part in a multi-skills tournament in Boston this week. They finished top with the most points. Mr Lawlor said that they did an excellent job of representing the school. Well done to you all.
