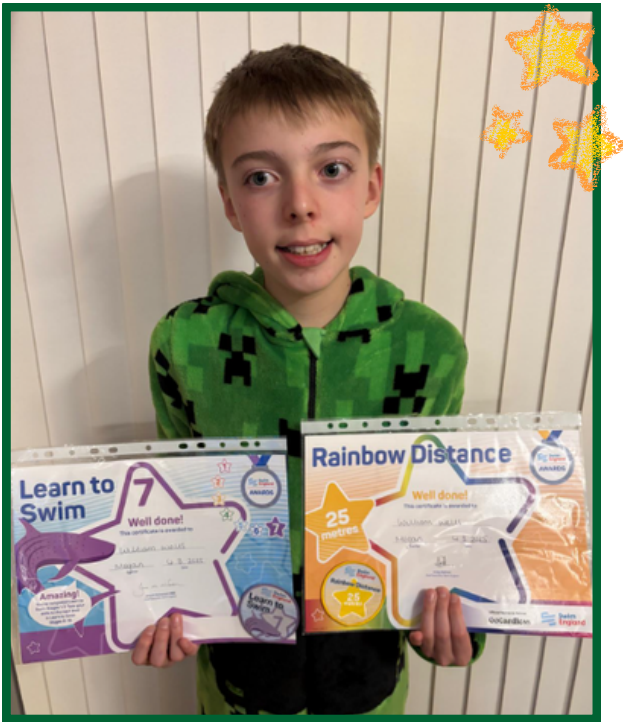

Butterflies Class

This week in butterflies we have been continuing to learn all about occupations. Throughout the week, the children have learnt about the importance of good oral hygiene whilst focusing on the job role of a dentist. They took part in a tooth brushing activity where they cleaned the germs and dirt from the laminated teeth, and they also took part in experiences focusing on the subject of healthy eating. Whilst learning about chefs, we linked this job role to pancake day, where the children took part in a cutting and sticking activity making pancake faces, practiced flipping pancakes, used toppings to extend repetitive patterns and of course, ate them for their snack!
