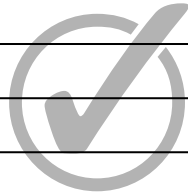

PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

We've had a fun and adventure-filled week digging into all things vegetables, getting to know the brave Supertato, and climbing into the world of Jack and the Beanstalk! Building on last week's planting experience, we explored vegetables by chopping up carrots and potatoes for snack and using them for art printing. Inspired by Supertato, the children created their own superhero vegetables complete with capes and masks.

We had great fun listening to and recreating the traditional tale of Jack and the Beanstalk. The children crafted their own beanstalks—some tall and twisty just like Jack's—and explored the concept of big and small by comparing sizes. They practiced story sequencing using pictures and confidently recited familiar phrases like "Fee-fi-fo-fum!" We also made our own magical harps using junk modelling materials and elastic bands.

In the tuff tray, we explored 'magic' beans using tweezers, helping to strengthen fine motor skills and develop number knowledge through counting.

A highlight of the week was a visit from our local police officers! The children had a fantastic time exploring the police car, listening to the sirens, watching the lights, and learning about how police help keep us safe. They showed excellent listening skills and represented our preschool with pride—we're so proud of them!



PRESCHOOL NEWS

Butterflies Class

This week in butterflies we have been learning all about three very important job roles - our incredible emergency services!

Throughout the week, the children have practiced making imaginative '999' calls, learning how to confidently ask for help in an emergency. They reenacted the role of a paramedic, where they pretended to arrive at a scene, assess the situation, and provide treatment to their peers as needed. The children also learned some basic first aid skills, where they practised applying bandages and using slings! While learning about firefighters, the children practised their number recognition whilst using spray bottles to put out the 'fires' from around the garden. They pretended to rescue the families and pets from our 'on fire' dolls house and they also used a range of 2D shapes to create their very own fire engines. We were incredibly lucky this week as whilst focusing on the job role of the police we were thrilled to welcome two police officers into the setting - and what a memorable experience it was! The police officers spoke about their important role in the community, and they discussed the many ways they help people. The officers showed us some of the equipment they use in their day to day work and they also shared a very important message about road safety.

One of the highlights of the visit was definitely seeing the police car up close - especially when the lights flashed and the siren sounded!





NEWS FROM THE FOREST

This week at Forest School, we've been enjoying the sunshine and observing how beautifully the forest is flourishing in the warm weather. We've been learning about the summer season and exploring how the forest grows and changes during this time.

We've also started preparing our garden area for planting. The children have been busy turning the soil and sorting bulbs, ready for the growing season ahead.
