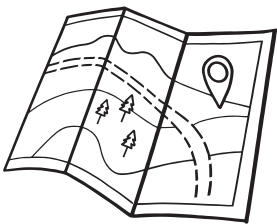
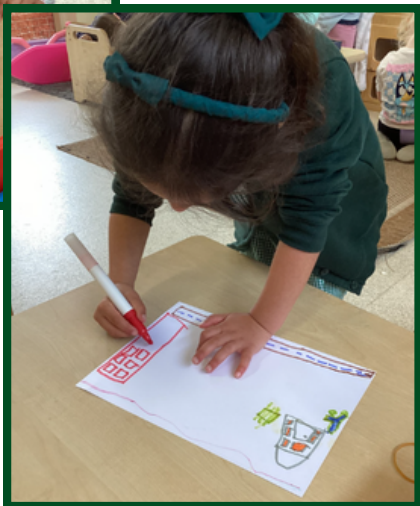
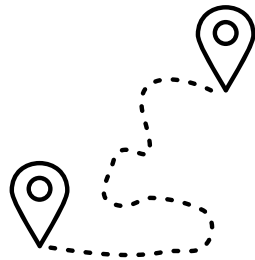


PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

This week in Caterpillars, we have been discovering the wonders of their everyday world, starting with their journey to school! Whether they walk, ride in a car, or take the bus, each child had a chance to talk about what they see on their way: houses, trees, traffic lights, shops, pets, and even the occasional digger!

Using maps, drawings, and storytelling, we explored different routes and talked about familiar landmarks. The children also enjoyed building their own miniature towns with roads, schools, and signs, helping them understand how communities are connected.

Butterflies Class

This week in Butterflies, we have been exploring the magical world of traditional tales!

While focusing on the classic *The Three Little Pigs*, the children have been using their imaginations to think of alternative endings to the story. They've also been busy designing their own houses, carefully choosing which materials they would use if they were one of the pigs in the tale. The class came up with some fantastic ideas while painting new characters to replace the wolf, and they used a variety of resources to recreate the pigs' homes. The children have also been developing their storytelling skills by retelling the story using the puppets from the story sack! Following this, the class then explored the tale *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*, where they investigated sizes, materials, and textures. The children practised their sequencing skills whilst creating their very own versions of the book, and they have taken part in thoughtful discussions about stranger danger.

To finish off the week, the class enjoyed some delicious porridge for their snack - just like Goldilocks did in the story. They even used some of the Three Bears' oats to bake some extremely tasty banana flapjacks, too!

At the end of the session, parents joined us to see what their children had been up to, and it was a lovely way to round off a brilliant day outdoors.
