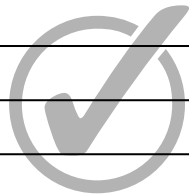

PRESCHOOL NEWS

Caterpillars Class

This week we continued our exploration of the world around us, routes and maps!

We started by exploring the world with Google Maps! The children had so much fun showing us the local library, co-op, their 'big' school, the dentist and even how to get to their houses!

The children then worked together to make houses, towers, bridges, and even pretend roads with the wooden blocks! We talked about shapes, sizes, and how buildings stay strong. We allowed us to also practice using shapes with a purpose—choosing circles, triangles, squares, and rectangles to create houses, shops and dentists. The children thought carefully about which shapes would work best for each part of their creation.

We also had fun exploring patterns this week, with colors, shapes, and sounds. Whether it was lining up blocks in a red-blue-red-blue pattern, clapping to a rhythm, or decorating with repeating shapes, the children were noticing and creating patterns all around them.



PRESCHOOL NEWS

Butterflies Class

This week in Butterflies, we have been continuing our current theme of traditional tales. We started the week by learning about The Three Billy Goats Gruff, where the children explored engineering by building bridges using different materials to see if they could hold a small toy goat. The children also got creative with salt dough, carefully weighing and mixing ingredients to make their own trolls. Using their fine motor skills, they rolled, pinched, and shaped the dough before decorating them with pom poms, beads, and pipe cleaners.

We then moved on to the tale of Little Red Riding Hood, where we learned about healthy eating while choosing a basket of delicious treats for Grandma. The children also explored the crafting technique of weaving, where they created their own beautiful baskets. Lastly, we explored the tale of The Little Red Hen, where the children used a variety of 2D shapes to create hen-themed pictures. We followed the journey of how bread is made, from grain to loaf, and we also capped off the week by constructing 3D windmills of our own.





NEWS FROM THE FOREST

This week at Forest School, the focus has been on building friendships and enjoying the magic of the outdoors together. The children have been working in small friendship groups, playing, creating, and learning side by side in our beautiful forest setting.

They've had great fun building dens and trying out rope swings, all while supporting each other and sharing ideas. In the mud kitchen, their imaginations were hard at work as they mixed up 'recipes' and brought their woodland café to life using natural materials they collected themselves.

At the end of each session, we gathered around the fire circle for some quiet reflection. The children had the chance to talk about their day—who they played with, what they created, and why their friends are so special to them. It was a heartwarming reminder of how important connection and kindness are in their learning journey.



YEAR 3 TRIP TO FLAG FEN

Last week, year 3 had a fantastic time visiting Flag Fen, where we immersed ourselves in the lives of people from the Stone Age through to the Iron Age. The children explored genuine artefacts from these periods, learning how tools, materials, and daily life evolved over time. They got hands-on with history by making their own clay pottery, creating expressive cave paintings, and constructing wattle and daub panels. One highlight was testing their hunting skills by throwing javelins at a model deer! We also discussed how ancient roundhouses compare to the homes we live in today, helping pupils make thoughtful links between past and present. It was a fun, muddy and memorable day of learning!
