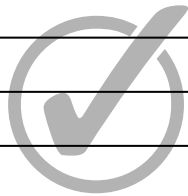

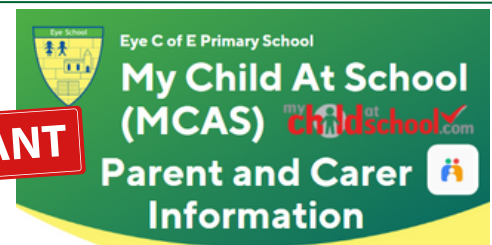

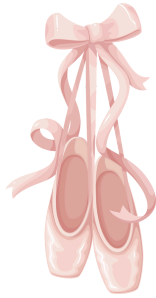
Your next steps:

4. Use the app to book wraparound sessions for September.



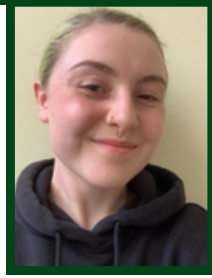
GROWING BEYOND SCHOOL

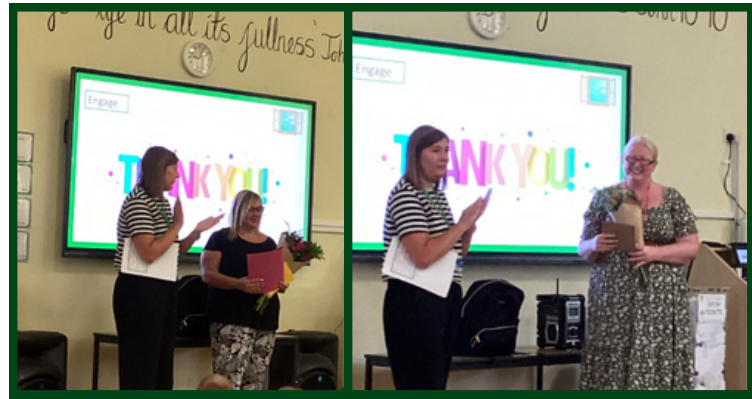


We also want to say farewell for now to Miss Rimes who will be beginning her maternity leave. We look forward to hearing about her new little bundle in the autumn term.
