



Her family are all super proud of her and we think this is a wonderful achievement, too! Well done, Harlie!




SPORTING SUCCESS

STEM CLUB



What is STEM?

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. These subjects help us understand the world around us, solve problems and invent new things. In STEM Club, we bring these subjects to life through fun, hands-on activities that encourage children to ask questions, think creatively and work together.

Who is STEM Club for?

STEM Club is open to children in Years 3 to 6 and is run by Miss Canham, our enthusiastic Maths Leader. Whether you're a budding scientist, a future engineer or just love experimenting, there's something for everyone in STEM Club!


What have we been up to?

It's been an exciting few weeks in STEM Club! We've been exploring the science behind everyday phenomena through hands-on experiments and plenty of fun.

We started by launching balloon rockets to see Newton's Third Law in action, discovering how every action has a reaction.

Next, we investigated the mysterious forces of magnetism, testing how magnets attract and repel.

Things then got colourful as we explored surface tension using milk, soap and food colouring, watching swirling patterns form as science came to life before our eyes!



STEM Club is all about curiosity, creativity, and discovery. We can't wait to see what we'll experiment with next!

This week in the forest, we've been making the most of the beautiful autumn weather! The children have loved playing in the leaves, searching for bugs and exploring the natural world around them.

They've enjoyed spending time with their friends building dens, creating wonderful autumn art pieces and getting delightfully messy in the mud kitchen! We also had great fun climbing trees and collecting shiny conkers.

It's been such a lovely week full of creativity, adventure and laughter in the forest.



PRESCHOOL NEWS

This week at preschool, we have continued our exploration of autumn. We went on autumnal walks in our school field and the also children brought in a variety of autumnal objects they collected while out and about with their parents, which has been a wonderful way to enrich our learning experiences.

We had fun creating leaf people using sticks, leaves and googly eyes, encouraging creativity and fine motor skills. We also used conkers to support our mathematical development by practising subitising and matching numerals to quantities. Our variety of leaves provided a great opportunity for sorting activities, where we categorised them by size. To finish off the week, we enhanced our mud kitchen by adding a selection of vegetables, which inspired the children to make their own version of "pumpkin soup." They thoroughly enjoyed role-playing with the vegetables and engaging in imaginative play.



WRAPAROUND UPDATES

This week in Wraparound, we were lucky enough to watch our Year 5s and 6s play football they played brilliantly and even won their match! We also had lots of fun making mud pies in the courtyard and made the most of the lovely weather by playing hide and seek outside and spending time in Forest School.

Some children chose to stay indoors and enjoyed getting creative with a range of different crafts. It's been a fantastic week full of fun, teamwork and imagination!



FOND FAREWELLS

We are sad to share that Mrs Richardson, our Forest School teacher, has made the decision to move on to pastures new, leaving us at the end of this half term. We wish her lots of happiness in her new role. Forest sessions will continue for the classes planned for Autumn 2 so children will still have exciting outdoor learning experiences.
