



BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

NEWS FROM THE FOREST

The children have continued to enjoy their time in the forest this week. It's wonderful to see the way they show such creativity, work together as a team and thrive being amongst nature.

A highlight in the forest this week was with the year 6 children, who created a game show style challenge using the equipment and resources available. As host, judges and contestants, they encouraged each other, provided constructive feedback and celebrated together.

PRESCHOOL NEWS

The children explored the meaning of Remembrance Day at the beginning of the week. They enjoyed making their own poppies using craft materials and playdough, which gave them lots of opportunities to practise their fine motor and scissor skills. We used our poppies for a fun maths activity, comparing sizes and ordering them from smallest to largest. The children did a fantastic job noticing size differences and using great mathematical language. On Monday, we also took part in the two-minute silence, they listened beautifully and showed great understanding and kindness.

We've also been learning all about the weather! The children created wonderful cloud pictures, using cotton wool and paint to explore different types of clouds and how they look in the sky. We had some great conversations about what clothes we might need in different types of weather, from wellies and raincoats for rainy days to sun hats and shorts for sunny days! The children enjoyed cutting, gluing and sticking different clothing items to match the weather and decorating their own wellie boots.


It's been Nursery Rhyme Week too, so we've been singing and acting out lots of our favourite rhymes!



WRAPAROUND UPDATES

At the start of the week, the children took part in Remembrance-themed crafts, creating beautiful poppy collages to mark this special occasion. Towards the end of the week, we turned our attention to the weather, with the children designing and making their own umbrellas and wellies using different craft materials. We also enjoyed some calming mindful colouring, encouraging relaxation and focus after a busy school day.

Our Key Stage 2 children have been busy enhancing their technology skills also this week, using the laptops to explore new programs and build confidence in their digital learning.



MATHS ASSEMBLY

Last Friday, KS2 children were fortunate to take part in a special assembly led by two representatives from Compare the Market, who visited our school to explore how maths is used in the world around us. The session helped pupils see the many ways numbers play a role in everyday life, from budgeting to problem-solving and encouraged the children to think about maths as a useful and exciting skill. This event formed part of Number Confidence Week and supported our ongoing work to develop children's positive attitudes and confidence in maths.


