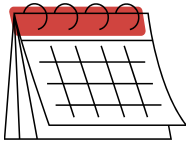
THIS WEEK AT EYE C OF E PRIMARY...

A big well done to Ella, Maggiemay, Allyson, Mikey and Jacob.



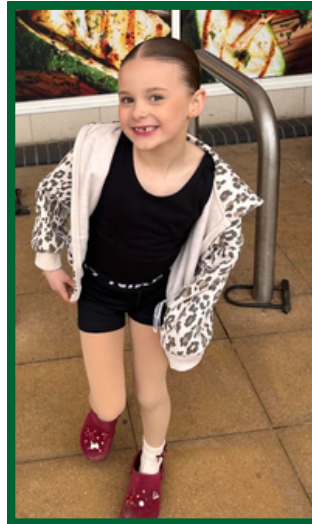
GROWING BEYOND SCHOOL

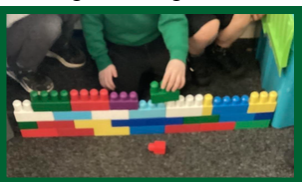
PRESCHOOL NEWS

This week we have been exploring the traditional tale of Goldilocks. In our tuff tray we investigated porridge oats, discussing amounts such as full and empty while also describing the different textures we could feel. We have been retelling the story using picture prompts, puppets and homemade accessories. The children particularly enjoyed wearing bear headbands and pretending to be the different characters from the story. During snack time, we even made our own porridge, which we enjoyed tasting with jam and slices of apple. This was a lovely way to connect our story with a real-life experience. We also explored early maths concepts by looking at small, medium and large, using these ideas to sort and organise objects during our play. To finish the week, the practitioners performed the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt using props and accessories. It made everyone giggle, and the children enthusiastically joined in with familiar phrases from the story - just like they were at a pantomime!



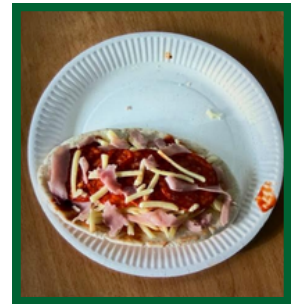
WRAPAROUND UPDATES

This week in Wraparound, the KS1 children have been exploring a range of different materials to design and build their own structures in the tuff trays. They showed great creativity while experimenting with how different materials can be combined to create stable and imaginative builds. Meanwhile, the KS2 children have taken a keen interest in making detailed paper aeroplanes. Using a guidebook to support them, they carefully followed the folding instructions to create a variety of different plane designs, paying close attention to the details of each folding arrangement.



COOKING CLUB

Our cooking club have had a great time making pitta bread pizzas together. First, they spread tomato sauce over the pitta breads and then chose from lots of different toppings. Some people added cheese and pepperoni, while others picked vegetables like peppers, and sweetcorn. It was fun to be creative and children enjoyed making their own unique pizzas. After baking them in the oven, the pizzas smelled amazing and tasted delicious. Everyone enjoyed sharing their creations and talking about which toppings they liked the best.



PARENTS MEETINGS

Thank you to all the parents who attended our Assess, Plan, Do, Review (APDR) meetings with their child's class teacher this week. It was great to be able to share your children's progress towards their targets with you and to look ahead to the next term.
