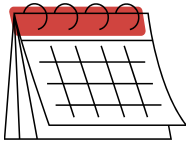
## THIS WEEK AT EYE COF E PRIMARY...

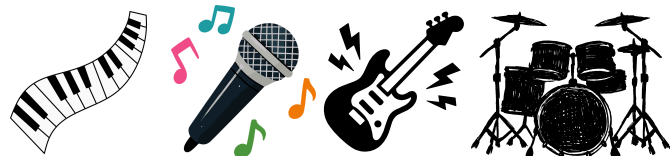
