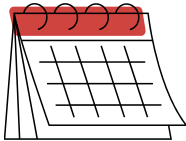
## THIS WEEK AT EYE C OF E PRIMARY...

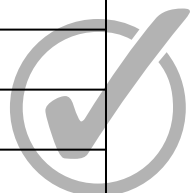

During snack time, we also explored the seeds found inside different fruits and vegetables. We discussed how the seeds looked different from one another and talked about what they might grow into.



### SCIENCE EXPERTS

Cassius and Lucas from Year 2 greatly impressed Mrs Jenkins with their excellent knowledge of plant reproduction. As the pre-school topic was planting, Mrs Jenkins invited them to deliver a short presentation about flowers to both classes. ### PENTECOST SERVICES

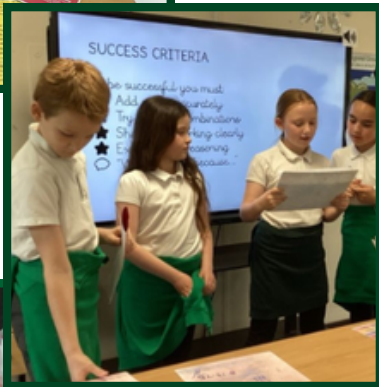
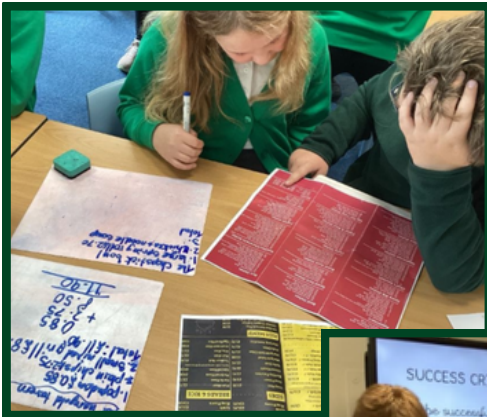
