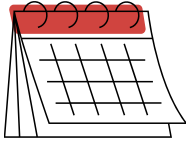
## THIS WEEK AT EYE C OF E PRIMARY...

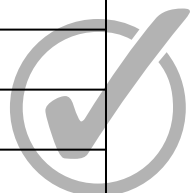

### A LETTER FROM THE PALACE!

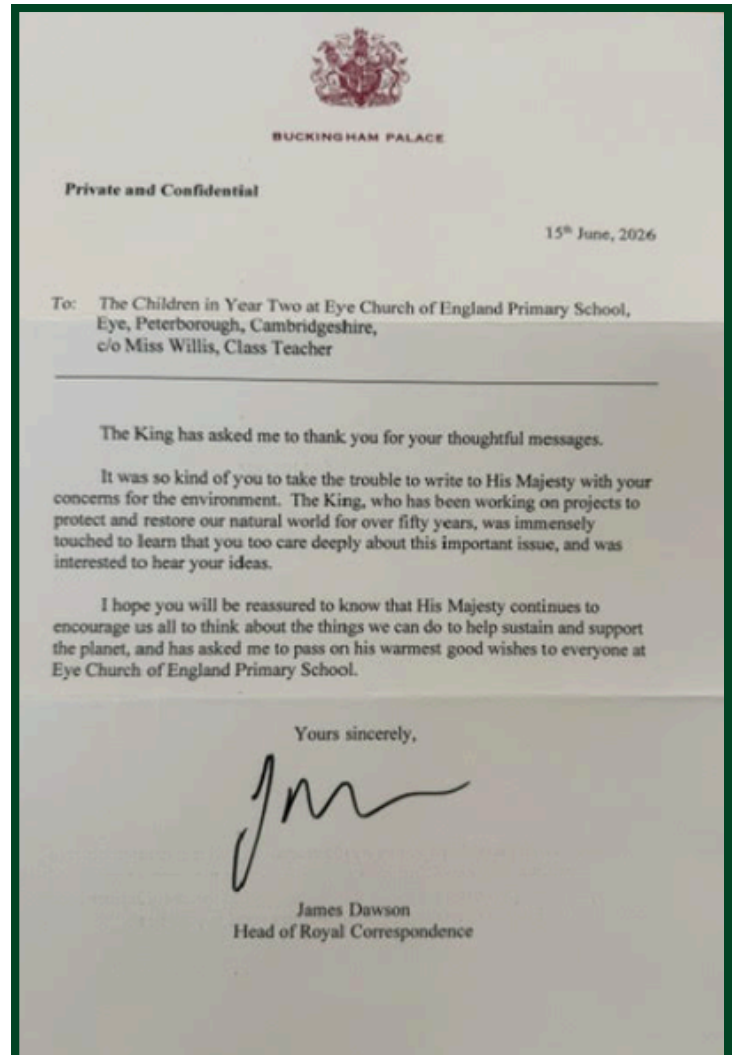

### CLASSES FOR SEPTEMBER

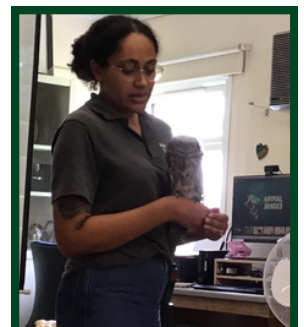
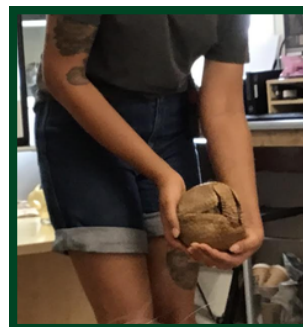
