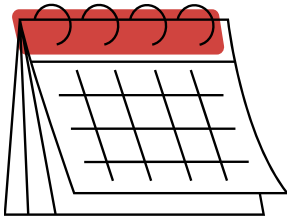

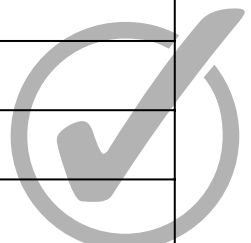

YEAR 3 TRIP

On Monday 6th July, Year 3 enjoyed a fantastic trip to Flag Fen to explore prehistoric life. Throughout the day, the children took part in a range of exciting, hands-on activities that brought their history learning to life.

They investigated a collection of real and replica prehistoric artefacts, learning how archaeologists use evidence to understand the past. The children also enjoyed creating their own clay crafts inspired by prehistoric techniques and designs.

A guided tour of the Flag Fen archaeological site gave everyone the opportunity to discover the fascinating remains of this ancient Bronze Age landscape, while a storytelling session inside the roundhouse helped the children imagine what life might have been like thousands of years ago.

It was a memorable day that has enriched the children's understanding of prehistoric Britain.
